Frequently asked questions (FAQs) – (ISBL, updated Oct 2022)

SRMA RECRUITMENT - INDUCTION AND ACCREDITATION

Candidates must attend an induction, ICFP training and review a case study before you apply to attend the accreditation panel. A deep working knowledge of ICFP is vital.

SRMAs What is the deadline for returning the SRMA application form?

- There is no deadline. ISBL is contracted by the DfE to recruit, train and retain a team of 150 SRMAs.
- Candidates must be signed up with one supplier before they attend the induction. ISBL is one of two national suppliers of SRMA to the DfE.

What do ISBL and EPI do?

- EPI is the contracted organisation who provides the induction, training and accreditation panel on behalf of the DfE, for candidates
- ISBL works with EPI, to support their candidates through the process

What if I'm self-employed?

- Yes, you can be self-employed and be considered as an SRMAs, if you meet the criteria.
- About 12/ the ISBL SRMA team are F/T or P/T self employed

If undertaking this role, would it be in addition to my current role in school or would it require full time hours?

- It would be in addition to your current role
- We encourage candidates discussing the role with your CEO / Principal / Head and Chair, as you will need time out of your current job to carry out a deployment an write a report.

When are the inductions running?

- Inductions are led by EPI and available for candidates to book on once a month
- They are normally on Tuesdays 10am-midday
- You book your place through ISBL
- This will help you decide if this role is for you. If you have the knowledge, skills and experience required

What will the induction and accreditation involve?

- There will be an online induction of two-hours available via a web-based activity which will provide you with an overview of the role and what is required.
- Following this there will be an opportunity for an individual telephone conversation with one of the assessors where you can ask any questions ahead of the accreditation panel. They will help you to know what preparation you need to do
- The accreditation will involve a desktop case study review and report exercise followed by an accreditation panel interview.
- Candidates have 24 hours to complete their case study.
- The panel discussion is online via Teams and takes a max of 90 minutes.



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When and where will the accreditation panel sessions take place?

- Dates for the panels will be made available to supplier organisations once the EPI have confirmed.
- Accreditation panel sessions time slots will be made available to candidates who have completed
 the induction process, and the accreditation desk top case study review.
- Candidates can book their place based on availability at that time, via ISBL
- If candidates cancel in the 24 hours before the panel this counts as one 'go'
- Candidates are allowed to have 2 attempts in a 12-month period

Will I be paid to attend the accreditation panel session?

- You will not be paid to attend the panel
- You will be paid £400, if you pass the accreditation panel
- This is an acknowledgement of the hard work is takes to prepare and pass.

SRMA WORK – DEPLOYMENTS

What is remuneration for the post?

• £400 (including VAT) per day, plus up to £100 per day travel expenses.

How many hours will the post be per week?

- There is no set amount of work per week, as the only commitment is that SRMAs are both willing and able to undertake a minimum of two deployments in the 12 months after accreditation.
- Standard deployments take up to 5 days. Some take more, e.g., supporting a MAT or a local authority (LA).
- The deployments made available will depend on the schools identified as requiring support by the DfE each month to the suppliers. Some take less, e.g. one off support for a specific issue.
- ISBL cannot guarantee days of work in addition to the two deployments that each SRMA must undertake to maintain their accreditation each year.

How many deployments will I be expected to undertake?

• On successful completion, you must commit to at least two deployments of up to five days per year. You can invoice ISBL £400 per day, plus up to £100 per day of travel expenses, payable via your employer school or directly where you are self-employed.

Will overnight stays be required?

- This is rare and we work to avoid this by matching SRMAs to nearest locations for deployments.
- In the event they are required, we will deal with this on a case-by-case basis based on a cost needs analysis.
- Agreement must be made from ISBL to the DfE central Team. This cannot be agreed by the DfE case lead.
